

Cindy Van Kley – "Invoking Your Artistic Spirit with Inspiring Quotations" Guest Artist Demo 6:30 pm Monday October 7 at MWC Library

Cindy Van Kley has been a member of Mid-Del Art Guild since 1979, worked as a graphic designer for PIP Printing for 20 years, and as a freelance graphic designer for another 30 years. She has been painting in a variety of media off and on for most of that time. "I've never met a media I didn't love!" she says. Currently she is primarily working in Acrylic paints and Gel Markers, but admits that soft pastels are her favorite.

For the past 3 years she has embarked on a special project every March during the Bahá'í 19-Day Fasting period. During this period all Bahá'ís around the world awaken each day before dawn to spend time in prayer and meditation on sacred writings, and to eat breakfast before sunrise (after which they do not eat nor drink until after sunset). Cindy decided to add an artistic component to the spiritual enrichment of the Fast, selecting a phrase or paragraph from whatever writings she read and meditated on that morning to interpret in a painting. To avoid getting too detailed or



"tight" in her paintings, she set a time limit of 19 minutes for each painting, forcing her to paint quickly and very loosely. She posted her paintings on Facebook along with the quotes which inspired them. The object is not to have a finished painting, just to see what can be accomplished in that short time while using the artistic expression to help with processing deeper meanings that may be extracted from the quotes through the process of turning them into art.

For this month's program, Cindy invites attendees to try out the process! She will do a sample painting and then she will provide to the audience a selection of quotations to choose from, canvas panels or art paper, and a variety of media, including watercolors, alcohol markers, gel markers, acrylic markers, oil pastels, colored pencils, and acrylic paints to choose from. This is a good time to experiment with a medium you seldom if ever use. Each will choose their own quote, be given a few minutes to contemplate-meditate on it, and then a timer will be set for 19 minutes for the first piece, followed by shorter times for subsequent pieces to enable the artists to loosen up more. Those who CHOOSE to, will be asked to share the quote they chose and their artistic interpretation. This will be a fun and enlightening experience for all of us! Above are a few examples of past pieces Cindy has done during her project.

Thank you to last meeting's guest artist: Sheila Minnich



Sheila Minnich shared a number of great tips and tricks as she did a colored pencil demo of a birdhouse and its resident bird. Since the company which made Ersta 400 pastel paper closed down, she uses Uart paper. She prefers 400 grit but Jerry's Artarama onlyl hasd 600 grit in stock. It uses up more pencil but she used it anyway. She always uses mineral spirits to blend Prismacolor pencils. She uses a small index card with a hole punched in it to compare colors from reference photo to her



painting. She wears compression gloves with no fingertips because she has arthritis, but they



also help with avoiding smears. She puts her mineral spirits into a jar lid, dips er brush in it and then dabs it on a papertowel before applying it to the paper. She mentioned you can also use watercolor pencils on watercolor paper. She also said you can use Prismacolor pencil on mylar or glass! You can add other colors after the solvent has dried on the paper.

She uses a kneaded eraser to clean up mistakes: going over the mistake with solvent, then picking up with the eraser. She taped the roof edge so she could keep a straight line. Sheila also mentioned that you can blend by coloring over other colors. She says she tells her students that you want your pencils SO SHARP you could poke somebody's eye out. She uses Prismacolor's VeriThin pencils (which are harder lead) for the tiny feathers and other fine details. She rubberbands groups of colors together to help find them easier. When a stub gets too short to use, she glues it with super glue to the end of another pencil. "I don't ever hold the pencil like I'm writing. I hold it out to the side and keep rotating it to keep it sharp." In addition to Prismacolor pencils, she also uses Caran d'Ache



and Derwent. She applies 3 coats of color. She also uses a piece of plastic, like a sheet protector, to protect parts of the paper from smearing while she's laying her hand over it to work in the middle. She says she doesn't like to do birds because they are too detailed, but she loves to do animals.
