Sheila Minnich – Colored Pencils Guest Artist Demo 6:30 pm Monday August 5 at MWC Library



Past Mid-Del Art Guild President Sheila Minnick has been an Oklahoma resident for 50 years. Currently she resides with her husband in Midwest City where she has taught colored pencil, pastels, acrylic oils and scratch board art. Sheila started studying oil painting in 1975 with well-known Oklahoma artist Dennis Parker. in 1978, her passion for painting was put on hold to begin a 24-year career with the US postal service. She started out working part time as a rural carrier and ended her career as the Post Master of the Cheyenne Arapaho Reservation Post Office. After retiring, Sheila decided to try her hand at painting once again and began teaching colored pencils at Eastern Oklahoma County Tech Center in 2003 for six years.

Sheila has shown her work in many national and international art exhibits,

winning numerous awards, and proudly has her artwork displayed in homes and businesses from San Francisco to Maryland. Her works have been published in The Artist's Magazine, The Pastel Journal, and in the Signature Showcase book published by the Colored Pencil Society of America of which she is a signature member.

One year she won two first place, one second, and one third place awards at the Mid-Del Art Guild show at the Paseo Art District in Oklahoma City. She is currently showing her work at the Paseo Gallery One.

Some of other artists she has studied under include Carrie Ballantyne and Albert Handell. Sheila's work is versatile, ranging from abstract still life to photo realistic animals. Her Hispanic background and culture have given her a love of color that she says makes her feel happy. Sheila added, "I would love for those who view my art to walk away with a sense of delight,

contentment, and big smile on their face." I (Susan Schmidt) am delighted with her dog portrait shown to the right. When I asked about



the dog with the concho necklace, Sheila said the family from Australia brought the dog with them to the youth rodeo!

You can tell when looking at her art, Sheila is fascinated with western themes in her paintings. She recently attended another International Finals Youth Rodeo in Shawnee where she took photos for use in her art.

Sheila talked a lot about the need to obtain releases from the models in her paintings. She often asked for the subjects contact info so that if she wants to use their image, she can obtain their permission. Once, Sheila was at the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum over the Memorial Day weekend celebration. She saw a "handsome" Mexican man in a sombrero, actually wearing the full garb of a caballero. Sheila followed him around snapping photos. Later she realized she didn't even know the ranch he was there with, much less his name. Luckily her daughter remembered the name of the ranch and Sheila was able to track him down and get a release.

She has good luck getting permission to paint the people in her paintings. In exchange she has been known to thank them with a print of the painting they are featured in. Sheila will share with the audience where she has prints of her paintings made as part of the August 5th demo for the MDAG.

Another recommendation, artists should "use good quality-colored pencils and lots of colors". Her choice is PrismaColor colored pencils. She will demonstrate how she uses Gamblin non-odor solvent with her colored pencils to obtain a pastel or watercolor appearance. You won't want to miss Sheila's demo. At this point a workshop has not been planned but may be arranged at the last minute or for a future date depending on the interest.



Sheila tries to live by her favorite Bible verse, Proverbs 3:5 - 6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding, but in all of your ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct your path." When she paints, Sheila says she leans on him and asks for his direction. "He hasn't failed me yet." "Even if the painting doesn't turn out as planned it is a learning experience."

Section 14.2 of the August 7, 2023 bylaws states:

"NOTE: The winner of the Member's Choice is not eligible to enter again for one month, but can enter for Judge's Choice at any meeting. If an artist who won the previous month brings artwork the following month it must be labeled as ineligible for Member's Choice before members' vote." The board has interpreted "the Member's Choice" to mean first place.
